

VAT Relief T&Cs

If you have declared you are eligible for VAT relief and you are found not to be eligible, you will be liable for the outstanding VAT.

BTT Health Solutions Ltd. accepts no responsibility or liability for false VAT exemption claims.

Please note VAT relief is only available for purchases made for personal or domestic use. Purchases intended for business or clinical use are not eligible. VAT relief for chronic illnesses and disability is only available for UK residents. All other VAT calculations will be in accordance with local VAT regulations.

You do not qualify if you're elderly but not disabled, or if you're temporarily disabled.

A long-term condition is an illness that cannot be cured. It can usually be controlled with medicines or other treatments.

Examples:

- a physical or mental impairment that affects your ability to carry out everyday activities, for example blindness.
- a condition that's treated as chronic sickness, like osteoporosis.
- a terminal illness

If you're not sure whether your condition means you're chronically sick or disabled, you may wish to consult a doctor or other healthcare professional.
